As an open admissions institution,

CCAC is pleased to provide educational opportunities for all students. Everyone attending CCAC must complete an application for admission. There is no application fee. If you have a high school diploma or GED, you are eligible for admission as a full-time student. Although CCAC does not require entrance examinations, first-time, full-time students with no previous college coursework will be required to take placement tests before enrolling in classes.

Admission to the college does not constitute acceptance into a limited-admission program. If you indicate a preference for one of these limited-admission programs, request a packet containing complete information on how to apply to that program.

Enrollment Steps

- 1** Complete the attached admissions application. An online application is available at ccac.edu.
- 2** Apply for financial aid by submitting the FAFSA form, available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.
- 3** First-time degree, certificate and diploma seeking students are required to complete an online or an on-site student orientation before registering for classes. Visit ccac.edu/orientation for more information.
- 4** Review placement testing requirements and exemptions, as well as preparation tips at ccac.edu/placement-tests. If you are a full-time, associate degree seeking student who does not have one of the exemptions listed, please schedule a placement test using Appointment Central: ccac.edu/appointment-central. Don't forget, a photo ID is required for placement testing and registration.
- 5** Meet with an academic advisor to discuss your education plan. New students and students in several other categories are required to meet with an academic advisor. If you plan to transfer to another institution, we strongly urge that you meet with a counselor as soon as possible.
- 6** Register for classes. A photo ID is required; additional requirements can be found at ccac.edu/registration-services.
- 7** Pay for classes. A complete listing of tuition and fees can be found at ccac.edu/payment.
- 8** Submit your final transcripts. Include high school/GED and any college transcripts.

Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degrees include specific coursework along with a core of general education courses in English, mathematics, science, social sciences and humanities. Many students enter the workforce with associate degrees. Others wish to work with counselors and transfer to four-year institutions to pursue bachelor's degrees, using articulation agreements between CCAC and nearly 30 other universities or using certain degrees designed as templates for specialized programs. Associate degrees require at least 60 college credits and take 15 to 24 months of full-time study (longer for part-time students).
