CLE Landlord & Tenant: Covenant of Quiet Enjoyment: This three hour course will discuss The Implied Covenant of Quiet Enjoyment and Constructive Eviction. The Implied Covenant of Quiet Enjoyment in a lease requires that the landlord refrain from interfering with the tenant's use of the leasehold and is breached when the tenant's possession is impaired by the acts of the landlord. A constructive eviction is a total breach of this covenant, but a breach can be partial. We will explore this developing legal concept through case law arising in Pennsylvania and elsewhere.
